June Mission ARCC Emergency Shelter

The ARCC Emergency Shelter's mission is to provide safe shelter and supportive services to those experiencing intimate partner violence. Excerpts from an article in the Park Rapids Enterprise, the need for an emergency shelter in the Akeley area is urgent: White said many people leave a domestic violence incident with nothing except the clothes on their back. "We have to get them somewhere, so when there's a crisis in the middle of the night, having someplace close by is really a benefit," she said. "The greatest thing you can do for children who have experienced this kind of trauma is give them a routine and stability and a safe and secure environment," said White. "We had a woman that we helped last month who wrote a thank you note that said this was the first time she slept through the night in five years."

The ARCC Emergency Shelter Committee is composed of members who have a range of valuable expertise in various fields that have direct application for the shelter. These include security, police procedure, healthcare, education, social work, rental management, and construction. The committee has made a deep commitment of time and financial resources to establish and manage the ARCC Emergency Shelter.
